

Character Type 3

(Keynotes)

Other Names: Psychopathic, Deceptive, Seductive.

Makeup: Varies (see sub-types).

Developmental Age: 18 months to 3½ years.

Body Type:

Varies (see sub-types).

Description:

Beginning to realise own power.

Fluctuates between autonomy and still needing help at times.

Parent either belittles child's vulnerability (i.e. "boys don't cry"), or uses the child's expressions of vulnerability to thwart the child's expressions of autonomy.

Feels that showing vulnerability leads to being abused or manipulated.

Takes the message "It's not safe to be vulnerable or show true feelings".

Survives by not showing true feelings, especially vulnerability and weakness.

Becomes calculating and careful.

Tries to outguess parent(s).

Develops heightened awareness of the moods/motivations of others.

Learns to deceive to get his/her own way.

Compulsive liar.

Eventually may lose self in own deceptions.

Cannot distinguish between lies and truth.

Loses touch with own feelings.

Will not be vulnerable.

Wants power over others. Hard to operate on an equal basis with others.

Sets self apart from others. Feels alienated; an outsider.

Comes to see self as 'special'.

Exaggerated sense of own power/capabilities/destiny.

Project image of being special. May deceive others into believing this – become leaders/gurus.

Not as bothered by normal human anxieties – may be seen by others as superior or enlightened.

Surrounds self with followers – people who believe her/his press.

Great difficulty with intimate relationships or with equality in relationships.

Can be close only if other person needs them or looks up to them.

In return for respect or admiration can be very generous, charming and giving. Often in relationship with orals.

Others can become frustrated by his/her lack of intimacy. He/she finds demands to be vulnerable threatening.

Underlying defences are feelings of orality, weakness, vulnerability and longing for intimacy (will not give in to these).

Tremendous degree of rage at how was manipulated by parent(s) – tightly suppressed as it wasn't safe to show this.

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All feelings kept in control. Lives in head; in thoughts and fantasies.
Can end up completely cut off from feelings, especially of empathy or love. Can become cold and calculating.

Can be great leaders, teachers, performers, gurus.
Charming. Entertaining. Great company.
Inspires and motivates others.

Type 3a.

Other Names: Charming psychopath, psychopath 2, deceptive 2, charming/manipulative.

Makeup: SNS dominant, ungrounded, high CC.

Developmental Age: 18 months to 2½ years.

Body Type:

Medium build. Toned.

Attractive. Charismatic.

When older, look younger than they are – Peter Pans.

Eyes are penetrating and/or seductive.

Base of skull and jaw extremely tense.

Upper body may be bit more developed than lower body. Pelvis may be thin. Buttocks and legs tight.

Voice is quiet, soft, smooth, seductive.

Description:

All the general CT3 characteristics above with...

Primary defence is to charm and seduce.

Agreeable, nice, polite, gentle, sociable, friendly. But always keeps self apart in some way.

Charismatic, entertaining, witty, fascinating. Or bland and inoffensive.

Generous, kind.

Adaptable, versatile. Chameleon.

Image conscious. Well groomed.

Gets own needs met by manipulating others.

Type 3b.

Other Names: Tough psychopath, bullying psychopath, psychopath 1, deceptive 1, tough/generous.

Makeup: PSNS dominant, grounded, high CC.


Developmental Age: 2½ years to 3½ years.

Body Type:

Solid, stocky. Well built. Either toned or overweight.

Upper body very powerful. 'V' shaped body.

Eyes penetrating.



Base of skull and jaw extremely tense.
Neck thick and tense.
Barrel chest.
Shoulders and arms well developed.

Voice powerful, hectoring.

Primary strategy is to overpower others.
Gets own needs met by overpowering others.
Projects image of "not to be messed with". May allow self fits of rage.
May also be generous and kind.

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
